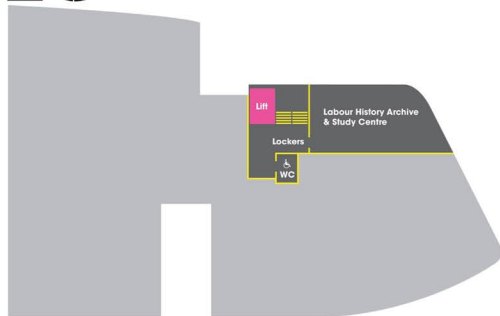

With assistance from our staff, the **Labour History Archive & Study Centre** is the place to access the outstanding collections of the museum's Labour History Archive. Visits are by appointment.

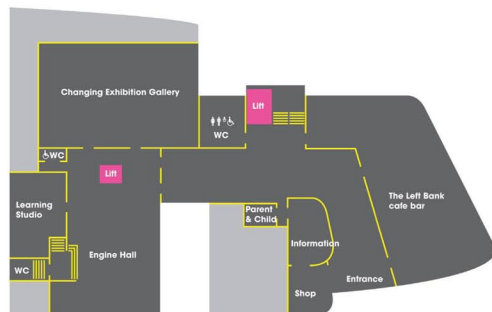

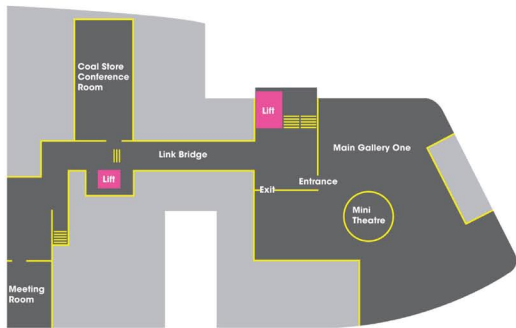

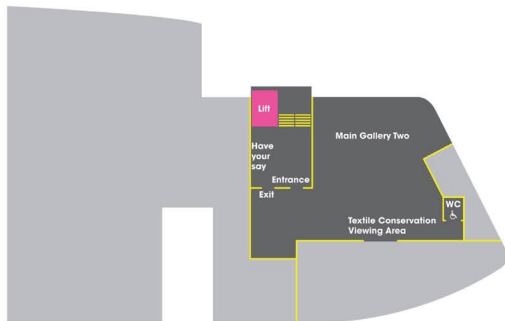

Main Gallery One tells the museum's story up to 1945. Four sections – Revolution, Reformers, Workers and Voters surround the **Mini Theatre**, where Living History performances bring the past to life. Lectures and talks take place in the **Coal Store Conference Room** and **Meeting Room**. Both are also available to hire – just the place for a meeting of minds.
