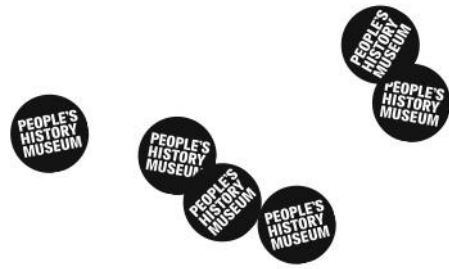

Citation Policy

For bibliography reference please note the institution as **Labour History Archive and Study Centre (LHASC), People's History Museum, Manchester**

In footnotes the institution should be referred to as **The Labour History Archive and Study Centre (LHASC)**. Subsequent references can be shortened to **LHASC**.

Citing sources used in research correctly is important not only as good scholarly practice but also to assist future researchers and archivists. When citing material held at the LHASC, it is necessary to give the name of major collection, e.g. Labour Party or Communist Party of Great Britain, plus any sub-divisions e.g. International Department or General Secretary's Papers followed by a specific file reference, where these exist.

Please note the citation form can be modified to meet the requirements of whatever style manual is used.
